Sermon outline notes: Romans 15: 1-13 'A Good Atmosphere!'

Introduction

As Paul draws his letter to a close he outlines four features of church life which he regards as tremendously important.

- 1) Church should be a place where there's an 'atmosphere' of mutual help, verses 1-3.
 - Following on from what he said in chapter 14 about the strong and the weak, Paul is picking up that theme in a more general way.
 - Bear-literally to carry
 - Verse 2 Weaker members of society should find help and support in church. Unlike the law of the jungle which is survival of the fittest, in church the principle is the unselfishness of the fittest.
 - Verse 3 In the supportive ministry about which Paul is speaking
 we have a powerful example in Jesus. Jesus did not seek his own
 comfort, he willingly gave himself that we weak sinners might be
 saved.
- Church should be a place where there's an 'atmosphere' of Bible study
 - Paul here is simply taking for granted the authority of the scriptures.
 - Note the extent—everything meaning the whole of the Old Testament.
 - Note the purpose to teach us
 For the ignorant Christian the scripture will instruct us
 For the persecuted Christian the scripture will give endurance
 For the downcast Christian the scripture will give encouragement
 For the doubting Christian the scripture will give confidence and hope.
 - The Christian church must be a place where the Bible is not simply revered, but is used and seen to be at the centre—where it is studied.
- 3) Church should be a place where there is an 'atmosphere' of communal worship- verse 5

- Spirit of unity—literally think the same things among yourselves. (see Philippians 2: 1).
- The test of Christian unity is not total unanimity, agreement on every issue, the test is worship in the sense that when a stranger comes into a church he/she ought to feel that here is a community of people totally united in their devotion to God and their expression of it.
- 4) Church should be a place where there is an 'atmosphere' of radical social harmony, verse 7.
 - It is almost impossible to over exaggerate the gulf that separated Jews from the Gentiles in the ancient world. The Jews were involved in a double hatred—they hated the world and the world hated them. But in Christ says Paul there is no Jew nor Gentile.
 - The church for Paul was a new society where old social distinctions had become irrelevant.
 - Paul quotes four Old Testament scriptures each containing the word 'gentile', showing that all through the Old Testament period the gentiles were in God's mind. It was always God's intention to bring the non-Jewish world into the blessing of knowing him.

- 2) Go through verses 1–16 listing all the things for which Paul commends these people. What does this show about the way we ought to measure a person's success in life?
- 3) Verses 17–18 What do you think Paul has in mind here?
- 4) Verse 19 What does it mean to 'be wise about what is good, and innocent about what is evil'? How do we do this?
