Sermon Outline Notes: The Holy Spirit in the Gospel of John

1) Introduction

In John's Gospel there is a very real contrast being drawn for us between the task and work of the Spirit under the old covenant (that is before Jesus) and the task and work of the Spirit in the new covenant after Jesus. There is a real distinction put forward by John and I think this distinction could be expressed in this way:- 'In the new covenant following the death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus, the Holy Spirit is set free, is set loose on the earth in the lives of those who are followers of the Lord Jesus Christ.'

2) John 7: 37-39

- Note this is a public proclamation during the Feast of Tabernacles.
- The promise is 'very Jesus centred.'
- As scripture has said—probably a reference to Ezekiel 47: 1–12
- The explanation—the gift of the Spirit after Jesus' death, resurrection and ascension.

3) John 14-16

- (i) 14:16 another—another of the same kind
- (ii) Counsellor— Greek paraclete In 1 John 2:1 the word is used in the sense of what a defence lawyer does.
- (iii) The Father and the Son are the source of the gift of the Spirit -14:16; 15:26; 16:7.
- (iv) To be with you forever 14:16
- (v) The Spirit of truth 14:17; 15:26; 16:12
- (vi) The Spirit as person—John uses masculine pronoun 'he' to refer to the Spirit.
- (vii) The role of the Spirit 15:26 'He will testify about me' says Jesus.
- (viii) The convicting work of the Spirit— John 16: 9-11

Conclusion

The above is a summary of John's distinctive contribution to our understanding of the Spirit. It contributes immensely to our understanding of the Trinity and the Spirit's role in the believer's life.

Points to Ponder

- 1) Was anything said that you did not understand or with which you disagreed?
- 2) What particular points stood out for you?
- 3) There is a particular emphasis on the phrase 'Spirit of truth'. Why do you think this emphasis is there?
- 4) How would you paraphrase the teaching of John on the Holy Spirit in chapters 14 -16? How does John differ from Paul and Luke?
- 5) Did the sermon change anything in your thinking, understanding and future behaviour?
