SERMON OUTLINE NOTES:

Understanding Christianity The Holiness and Love of God

Introduction

God had revealed his attributes and character in his interaction and engagement with mankind which are recorded for us in scripture. Scripture is Gods revelation of himself. We must let that revelation 'speak' to us, and avoid saying 'Well I like to think of God this way!'

God has revealed himself to be a 'holy God' and a 'God of love'. If we are to understand the Christian Gospel we must understand these two attributes of God.

1) The God who is holy.

- Both the Old Testament and the New Testament reveal God to be absolutely righteous, perfect in all his ways, pure and always doing what is right.
- In the Scripture it is recorded that two men have had visions of God—Isaiah in the Old Testament (Isaiah chapter 6) and John in the New Testament (Revelation chapter 1). In both visions the holiness of God is emphasised—Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord Almighty.
- Both Isaiah and John are afraid in their visions as they realise they are flawed and fallen men now standing in the presence of the God who is awesome in holiness.
- Scripture teaches that all of us will have to give an account of our lives to this holy God and because of our failure, our sin, we will stand condemned at the last judgement.

2) God is Love I John 4 v8.

 At the heart of the Christian gospel is the truth that God desired to rescue humanity from the consequences of sin. This rescue can be summed up by the word salvation. God 'moved' into our world in Christ to deal with the judgement and punishment demanded by God's holiness.

- See John 3 vv 16-17; Romans 5 v8; I John 4 v9 as the classic expressions of the love of God expressed in the giving of Jesus.
- In Jesus' death on a cross God dealt with the sin of mankind and 'reconciled' the world to himself not counting men's sins against them. See 2 Corinthians 5 v19. Believers in what God has done in Jesus Christ stand forgiven, are declared to be members of his family, and are at peace with God. Believers in Christ no longer stand under God's condemnation (Romans 8 v1) but have a future hope of eternity in God's new heaven and earth.

Conclusion

Without understanding the holiness of God and the love of God we will never really understand the mission of Jesus, the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection. We need to believe in what God has done, i.e. have faith and when we do so we enter into 'a whole new dynamic of life' and we will be people who have real hope for the future
